Who? 4-H Members and volunteers both need to enroll in 4-Honline

When? Now! Before January 1st for returning members (see below)

Cost? Nothing! There are donations to cover the cost of enrollment

How? 1. Visit https://v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in

- 2. Existing login and member information has been transferred from the previous system. So only new families/volunteers need to create an account profile.
- 3. When Selecting payment method, choose "Payment for this invoice will be collected by 4-H Institution". Click confirm, but do not send a check for payment. The fee is covered! Any other option or putting in credit card information will delay the process!
- 4. The State 4-H office has provided a PDF enrollment guide, it can be found at this link.

Re-enrollment deadline: Re-enrolling 4-H'ers must be enrolled by January 1st to have their \$15 membership fee covered. The final date to add/drop projects will remain May 1st for everyone


#2 - Begin thinking about personal and club entries for 4-H Day in February. The 2025

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


What's Been Happening in the YLP?

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K-State Animal Sciences Leadership Academy

Twenty students gathered on the Kansas State University campus June 5-8 to gain livestock industry knowledge and develop leadership skills at the 15th annual K-State Animal Science Leadership Academy (KASLA) in Manhattan, KS.

During their time at KASLA, students participated in interactive leadership development and educational lab sessions led by faculty members from across the K-State campus. Participants completed the college experience by staying in the dorms, touring the animal science facilities, and engaging in several livestock industry tours. For their final project, the students were divided into groups during the week to focus on current issues affecting the livestock industry. ASI faculty mentors assisted each group in developing a presentation given as part of the closing reception.

Hosted by the K-State Department of Animal Sciences and Industry and sponsored by the Livestock and Meat Industry Council Inc., the academy's goal is to develop young leaders within the livestock industry and prepare them for a future in this field.

Plans are being made for the 2025 program! KASLA will tentatively be hosted in June, with applications being due in the spring. This program is open to students in grades 9-12. Please watch the <u>KASLA</u> webpage or Facebook page for additional details.





Dr. Bob Hines Kansas Swine Classic

The 2024 Dr. Bob Hines Kansas Swine Classic was hosted July 12-13 at the Riley County Fairgrounds in CiCo Park. There were 101 youth exhibitors from 32 counties who brought 250 swine projects to the event this year. Youth exhibited pigs in the prospect show, market show, and showmanship. There were also 69 kids who showcased their knowledge in the swine skillathon and 27 photos entered in the "People's Choice" photography contest. 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Important Announcements - Nominations & YQCA

State livestock nominations have transitioned to an online process. Families will need to plan ahead and prepare prior to the deadline to get everything completed on time. Please watch your email, the website, and the Facebook page for updates as we approach spring. Spread the word to any new families who will be nominating for the first time this year! Anyone who ordered extra DNA envelopes last year (or in 2022 or 2023) will be able to use them in 2025.

YQCA will continue to be required for all Kansas State Fair Grand Drive and KJLS exhibitors. <u>Youth for the Quality Care of Animals</u> (YQCA) is a national, multi-specie, youth livestock quality assurance program. Youth may complete the training online or through an instructor-led course with an approved instructor. Exhibitors will submit a copy of their certificate at the time of nomination, or when they order DNA envelopes, so make sure to download it to a device when kids complete the course. It is an annual training. Certificates must be valid through October 1, 2025 to be accepted.

Upcoming Events - K-State Junior Producer Days

We are excited to announce the dates for the 2025 <u>K-State Junior Producer Days</u>! The **Junior Swine Producer Day** will be Saturday, March 1. Tentative topics range from selection to health, and showmanship. The deadline to register is February 5. The cost is \$20/person by the deadline, or \$25 after. Only those registered by February 5 will receive a t-shirt. Attendance will also be limited to the first 400 participants to register. **Junior Meat Goat Producer Day** will be hosted Saturday, March 22. Tentative topics include selection to nutrition, and showmanship. Registration is due February 26 and will be capped at 400 participants. The cost is \$20/person and t-shirts are only guaranteed for those who sign up by the deadline. Late registrations will be \$25/person.

All youth, parents, leaders and extension agents are invited to participate in these one-day, family educational experiences. K-State faculty members, graduate students, veterinarians, extension agents, guest speakers and former exhibitors will provide the sessions. There will also be an optional instructor-led YQCA training at the conclusion of the program for both events, as well as a session over the state nomination process.
